WHERE DOES OUR **SUNDAY COLLECTION GO?**

The question of where the Sunday collection goes is frequently asked by parishioners. The answer is very simple: the offertory collection taken up every Sunday stays within the parish it's collected in.

Each of our five parishes has its own bank account and the Sunday collection is lodged to this account eg. Aughadown money stays in Aughadown - Skibbereen in Skibbereen etc.

The money in these accounts is primarily used to cover the day-to-day expenses of the parish, except for 10 per cent which goes to the diocesan fund, to finance programmes run by the diocese. A further 8 per cent goes to the priests' benevolent fund, for sick and retired priests. The remaining 82 per cent of the Sunday Mass collection goes to support the operations and needs of the parish, including routine maintenance, light, heat, insurance, church requisites, administration costs etc.

The four priests in the family of parishes do not receive any income from the Sunday collection — with the exception of Christmas Day and Easter Sunday.

The second collection taken up on various Sundays is lodged to a separate diocesan account and does not interfere with the normal collection.

The 2024 accounts for all of the parishes are currently being finalised and will be published in the newsletter when completed.
