WE CELEBRATE FUNERALS AT MASS — WHY NOT BAPTISMS?

he Christian community welcomes you with great L joy." These words are spoken at the beginning of a baptism ceremony. Doesn't it make more sense when the whoile community gathers to welcome the new member?



We celebrate baptism as part of the Easter Vigil. And baptisms can be celebrated as part of any Mass. If we all come to a funeral Mass to say goodbye to members of our faith community, why not gather to celebrate new members of our faith family, welcoming them 'with great joy'?

When baptism is celebrated during Mass, the priest welcomes the child

and their family just before the Opening Prayer. Mass continues with the readings and homily. The Creed is replaced with the renewal of baptismal promises. The child is then baptised with water and anointed. The godparents light the baptismal candle from the Easter candle and 'receive the light of Christ'. Mass continues with the bidding prayers, offertory and Communion. At the end of Mass, the congregation join the priest in blessing the parents. What a privilege to be part of such a celebration of new life!

Last week I wrote about the new baptisms rota in the Family of Parishes. Baptism during Mass is also an option as part of that new rota. Contact Annette in the Family of Parishes Office for further details.

HALF A MILLION PILGRIMS HAVE ALREADY PASSED THROUGH THE HOLY DOOR OF ST. PETER'S BASILICA FOR THE JUBILEE - Just two weeks after the solemn opening of the 2025 Jubilee year on Christmas Eve, already 545,532 pilgrims from all over the world have passed through the Holy Door of St Peter's Basilica at the Vatican. This is a very significant beginning, with a large turnout of people. The groups crowding along Via della Conciliazione give an important witness — they are a sign of the great sense of safety and protection that pilgrims experience in the city of Rome and in the areas around the four Papal Basilicas" said Archbishop Rino Fisichella, Pro-Prefect of the Dicastery for Evangelization, who is in charge of the organization of the Jubilee.
