


### A prayer for Mothers Day

# WHO PAYS OUR PRIESTS' SALARIES?

It's a question often asked: where do our priests' salaries come from? The answer is that the priests in our parishes do not get a 'salary'. Instead, the priests depend on the generosity of us, their parishioners.

Where does the income for the Parish clergy come from?

- Mass collections on Christmas Day and Easter Sunday these are the only two days when the church collections go to the priests in the parish.
  - Christmas and Easter dues
  - Spring and autumn station offerings
  - November novena offerings
  - 'Stole fees' offerings received for weddings, funerals and baptisms.
  - Chaplaincy fees from hospitals and nursing homes.

In Cork & Ross Diocese, the normal income for a priest in 2024 is €44,000 per annum. From this, each priest will pay income tax (as self-employed), car expenses, household costs (eg. light, heat, personal phone, broadband), health insurance, personal pensions, diocesan levies, clerical outfitters, computer costs and stationery, subscriptions, accountant's fees, education and training.

As the numbers of priests decrease, our expectations of them remain the same. It is important to show our priests not only financial support but also our continued appreciation.
